To prevent further damage to the structure, we have to replace the damaged parts of the building," he said.

Bharti was speaking after the groundbreaking of the temple's restoration and renovation project in Ujong Pasir, here, recently.

The temple, Bharti said, was visited annually by about 2,000 devotees who are not only Gujarati, but also Chinese and South and North Indians.

"This temple is also the venue of unique Gujarati celebrations, such as Navaratri, a festival dedicated to the worship of the Hindu deity Durga.

"Navaratri" means nine nights in Sanskrit, is an important and major festival for the Gujarati.

Malacca Gujarati Samaj president Nitin Kumar Gordhan said the committee was determined to highlight

the important festivals held in the Shree Ambaji Temple in the state tourism calendar.

"There are several Gujarati festivals every year, such as Makar Sangkranti, Maha Shivratri, Chaitra Navaratri, Ram Navami, Hanuman Jayanti, Shraavan Month, Raksha Bhandan, Saatam, Janmasthami, Shree Ganesh Chaturthi and Sharad Poonam.

"With these, we hope to open our doors to the public to help them understand better the culture and traditions of the Gujarati community," he said.

Nitin said the temple hall was also often used by locals of all races to hold events such as wedding dinners and marriage ceremonies.

"Therefore, we see the need to enhance the hall, including the installation of air conditioners," he said.

The entire project would cost about RM1.2 million.

"However, we still need more funds. We have applied for aid from the Federal Government and we are waiting for the approval of the Finance Ministry," he said.

The Gujarati community in Malaysia is small, with approximately 500 Gujarati in Malacca and 4,500 in Malaysia.
